



Recruitment Fraud Notice

At DGA, we are committed to maintaining the highest standards of integrity in our hiring practices. Unfortunately, job seekers across industries are regularly targeted by recruitment fraud.

Recruitment fraud often involves unsolicited emails or job offers from individuals posing as DGA representatives, requesting sensitive personal information such as bank details or Social Security numbers. These communications are typically from unofficial or generic email addresses.

DGA follows a formal hiring process that includes job postings on our official website (www.dgaonline.com), verified job platforms, and email communications from **@dga-mv.com**, **@dga-sf.com**, **@dga-sac.com** or **@dga-sd.com** addresses. Neither DGA nor our authorized recruiting partners will ever ask for payments of any kind. Do not trust information provided to you from any domain names other than **@dga-mv.com**, **@dga-sf.com**, **@dga-sac.com** or **@dga-sd.com**. If you are contacted by someone claiming to represent DGA and suspect fraud, do not provide any personal or financial information.

To protect yourself, always verify job postings on DGA's Careers page, and contact DGA directly at **hello@dga-mv.com** if you have concerns about a solicitation or job offer. DGA is not responsible for fraudulent offers made by third parties. We encourage all job seekers to stay vigilant and report any suspected fraud to the appropriate authorities.
